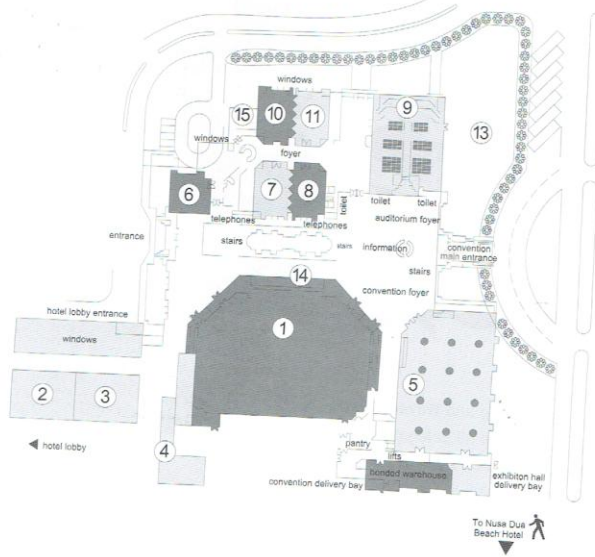
The logo for the 9th ICAAP has originally been developed by Nur Syamsi. The map of the globe represents the Asia-Pacific region, embraced by a network of people working toward a common goal to stop and halt the spread of HIV in the region, represented by the red ribbon in the shape of a person.

This mascots of the 9th ICAAP are named *Wayan* and *Putu*, names which are traditionally given to the first, fifth and/or ninth child in the Balinese family. Both names apply to any gender. Since this is the 'ninth child', we are using those names for our mascots. To make it easier for Indonesians to pronounce "ICAAP", the mascots' second names have been spelled the Indonesian way: *Aikep*. The Mascots are created by Bog-Bog, a Bali-based cartoon magazine.

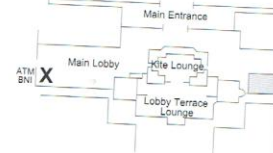


Bali International Convention Center Map

WESTIN LOBBY MAP



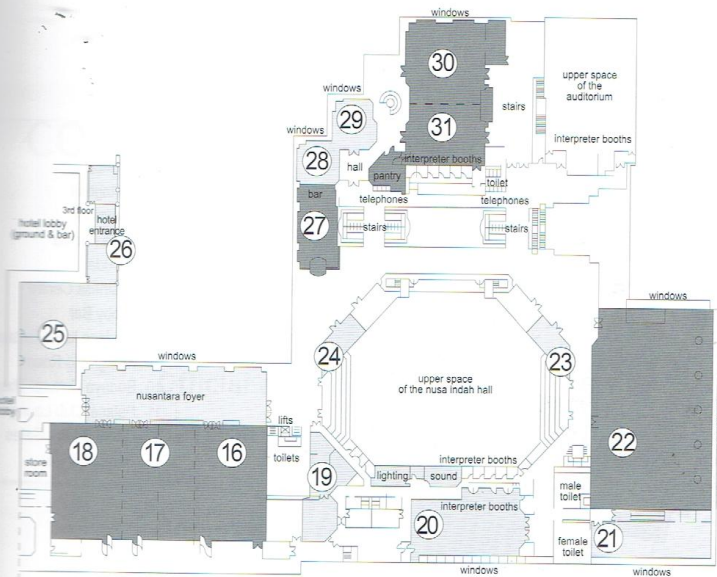

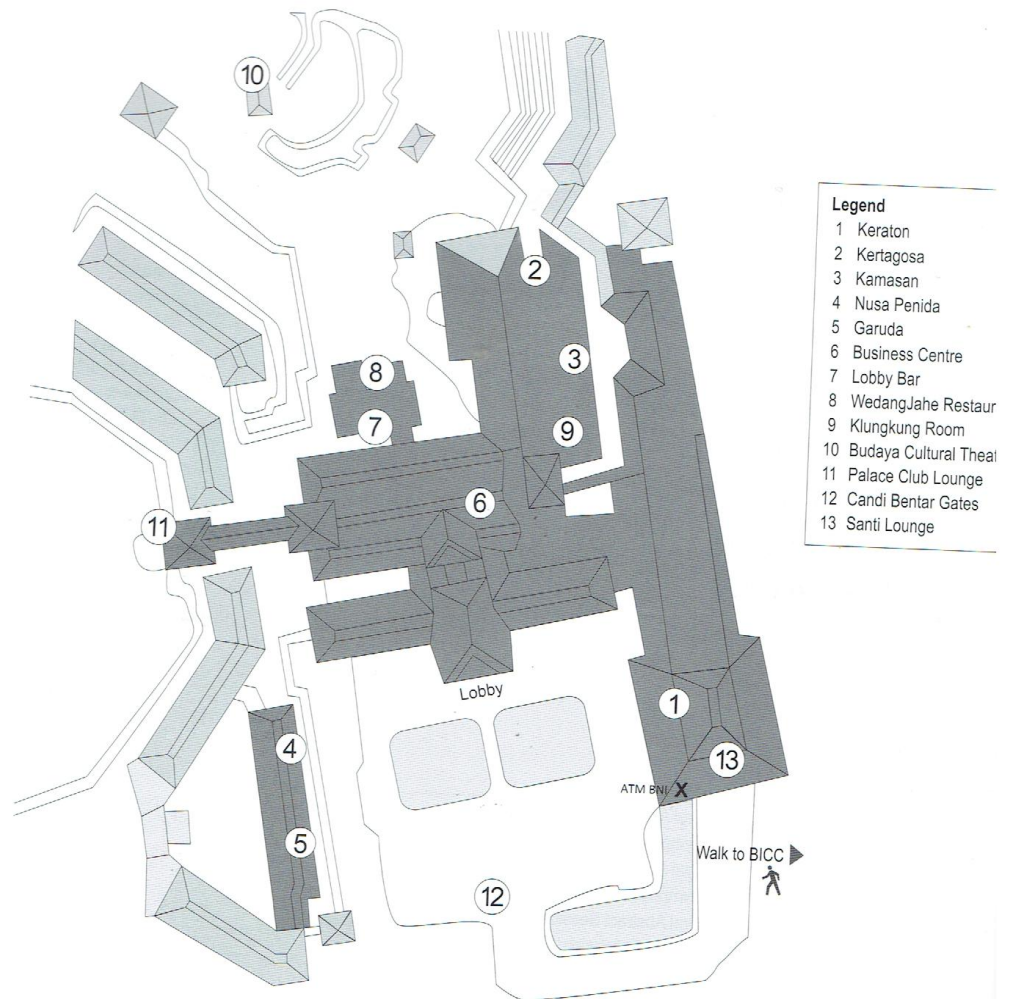

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WePBO83 Home-Based Care: Bridging the gap of care for People Living with HIV/AIDS (PLHA) in Bandung Indonesia

Issues By the year 2015, 11% of the total Indonesia hospital bed capacity is needed for PLHA. To deal with this, home-based care could be a good strategy to deliver health care as well as mobilize and strengthen care resources at family and community level. **Project** : Need assessment to develop a home-based care model for PLHA. Data were gathered through interview and observation with twenty-six PLHA and seven care givers during home visit for 6 months (June-December 2008), and then analyzed qualitatively by using content analysis. **Results** : The family was identified as the main source of support, hope, care, and encouragement. Basic nursing skills such as bathing on bed, wound care, feeding, and universal precaution were needed by family care givers. Medication adherence is one among the major issues that needs to be addressed in the provision of care. Psychosocial-spiritual support and basic information on care for dying and passed-away patients is needed at community and should build on available local resources. **Lesson Learned**: Home-based care service is needed to ensure continuum of care. Health care providers are challenged to strengthen the role of family or care-givers in addressing treatment adherence to be more effective and comprehensive in caring for PLHA.
