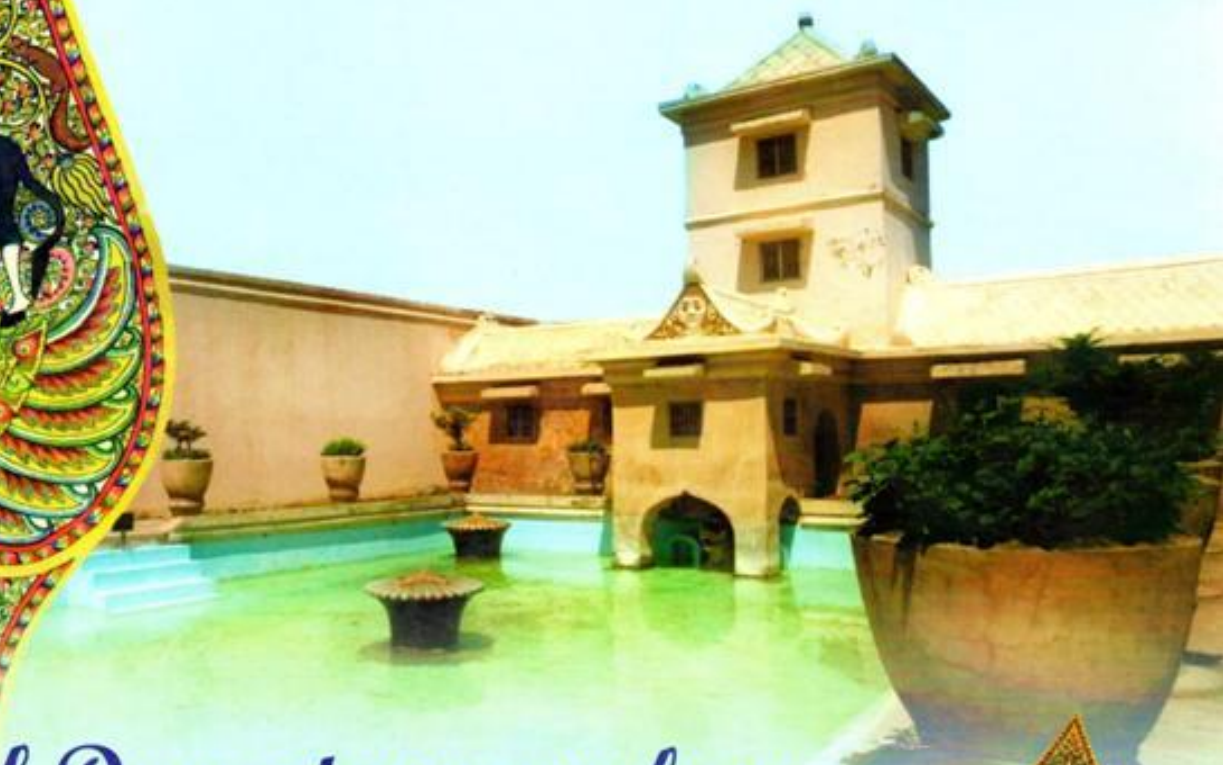

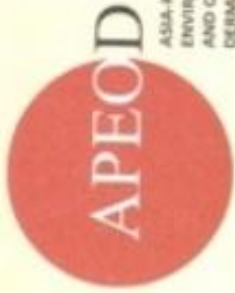

ATYPICAL HAND-FOOT SYNDROME DUE TO CAPECITABINE

Background. Hand-foot syndrome (HFS), or palmoplantar erythrodysesthesia, is an acute-onset symptom complex affecting the palms and soles. It is considered as a subtype of toxic erythema of chemotherapy, mainly elicited by 5-fluorouracil and its derivatives, eg. capecitabine (CAP). Early diagnosis and treatment is necessary because HFS may significantly impair patient's daily activities. Thus, it may interfere with patient's compliance to potentially effective chemotherapy.

Case. A 50-year-old Sundanese female with stage IV breast cancer presented with burning hyperpigmented macules, partially covered with scales, on both her hands and feet. 3500 mg of oral CAP daily was administered 5 weeks prior to consult. Hyperpigmented macules started to appear 1 week later. On the following week, the patient experienced burning pain which interfered with daily activities. The patient was treated with 300 mg vitamin E daily. Improvement of skin lesions and burning pain were noticed on the 18th day. Skin lesions were almost completely diminished on the 46th day, except for a few pigmented nevi on her fingers and heels.

Discussion. Hand-foot syndrome is generally characterized by dysesthesia on the hands and feet, followed by development of symmetric edema and erythema on the palms and soles. It may progress to blisters, desquamation, or necrotic tissues. Disparities have been observed in the clinical manifestations on non-white ethnicities, but it is still an under-discussed area. In these population, HFS often manifests with hyperpigmentation and keratoderma, may affect the dorsal aspects of hands and feet, and may rapidly deteriorate. This case represents an atypical case of HFS which presented as burning hyperpigmented macules on hands and feet.

ATOPIC DERMATITIS TREATED WITH NARROW BAND ULTRAVIOLET B

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Background. Atopic dermatitis (AD) is a common chronic and relapsing inflammatory skin disease. Therapy of atopic dermatitis is mainly based on topical therapies like moisturizers, corticosteroids, calcineurin inhibitors, and avoidance of trigger factors. Phototherapy, which has immunomodulatory effect has been used to treat atopic dermatitis, and is considered the second-line of treatment when adverse reactions occur and control is difficult with topical steroid given as first-line treatment.

Case. A case of 25-years-old male who suffered from AD for 18 years and treated with narrow-band ultraviolet B (NBUVB) was reported. Patient presented with erythematous macules and papules, hemorrhagic crusts, hyperpigmented macules, lichenifications, and scales. The diagnosis of AD was established clinically and also an increased in serum IgE level. The patient have tried many therapies like moisturizers, topical and systemic corticosteroids, and also topical calcineurin inhibitors before, but still no responses. Phototherapy was planned for 20 weeks, with initial dose 200 miliJoule and increased 10% in each meeting. Patient gave good result.

Discussion. NBUVB suppresses the production of interferon (IFN)- γ , interleukin (IL)-2, IL-12, and increases IL-4 and IL-10, which together could account for a shift of the immune response in the direction of T-helper (Th)2-like response. The shift from an IFN- γ -dominated Th1 to an IL-4 dominated Th2 response appears to be one of the major factors determining the therapeutic efficacy of NBUVB phototherapy. In this case, phototherapy efficacy was assessed every week using scoring atopic dermatitis (SCORAD). Before treatment, the SCORAD was 65.6 and on the 41st day of follow up, the SCORAD has reduced to 39.6.
