MASS MEDIA AND THE STORY OF NEW PROPHETS A CRITICAL DISCOURSE ANALYSIS OF THE ONLINE MEDIA REPORTS ON INDIVIDUALS WHO CLAIMED THEMSELVES AS **NEW PROPHETS**

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ABSTRACT

The issue of religion in Indonesia is considered very important and sacred. When there were individuals claimed themselves to be a prophet, it would always be associated with religious issues instead of psychological or a medical problem. This tendentious perception is encouraged by the reports in the mass media, which never looked at the issue of a new prophet from any other study. Subsequently, this situation has strengthened the stigma to those who actually suffer the illness. This research used Teun van Dijk's critical discourse analysis methodology to examine the text of stories in the media about people who had delusion to be a prophet and sell tickets to heaven. Research was carried out towards online media. By using the concept of health communication as behavior change interventions, this research analyzed the various texts related to the appearance of people who have stated as a new prophet. The results have shown the unfamiliarity of the mass media about people with psychiatric disorders. This could be seen from the news inter-textuality and the use of language in the media. Rather than explaining it in terms of medical problem, the media were preaching the stories sensationally. If this continues, the impact will be very hard for other sufferers.

INTRODUCTION

On February 2016, Indonesian religious leaders were surprised by the information from the media about an existence of a new prophet. Gus Jari, originated from Jombang East Java, claimed himself as a prophet and built a boarding school for his followers. He testified that he had heard whispers that called him as the prophet Isa. Isa is an Islamic prophet, which is known in Christianity as Jesus.

Before Gus Jari, there were several people who also claimed themselves as prophets. The stories of the new prophets have been published as sensational news by the media, who thought that the only reason of what those people did was religious blasphemy.

The inaccuracy of the media in reporting this sensitive issue has brought a major factor in the character of the message delivered. Poor understanding of journalists who did not fully understand this phenomenon has made the news tends to create opinions that are more destructive and unsettling. Journalists tend to proclaim the information that sensational,



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
